Christian Fandom

Christian Fandom is an interdenominational fellowship of fans interested in the courteous and accurate representation of Christian viewpoints in the science fiction and fantasy community. Our primary functions are to:

- Act as a support group for Christians who are struggling or feeling intimidated by the anti-Christian culture that dominates SF fandom.
- Act as a support group for Christian SF fans who are struggling with the anti-intellectual attitudes that exist in too many churches today, and with the suspicions that imaginative literature is demonic or worse.
- Share information about SF and fantasy that is being done from a Christian perspective, in all mediums (literary, music, art, etc.)
- Provide resources for educating the SF community, in order to demolish commonly held misconceptions about Christianity, including (but by no means limited to) the notion that being a Christian requires one to throw one's brains out the window, the notion that Christianity is not intellectually defensible, and the notion that Christian themes are inappropriate in SF.
- Network to support Christians who are trying to create SF and fantasy in all mediums, both in terms of encouraging new artists, and sharing information about commercial opportunities.

Specific activities we engage in include:

- Holding Christian Fandom meetings and parties at the World Science Fiction Convention and at some other regional SF conventions.
- Publishing a "recommended reading" list of Christian SF and fantasy.
- Communication on the Internet via a web page and an internet mailing list.
